### IOWA wins 1st place, again!

Wow! I am so very proud of our residents and our Residency Program. Thank you all for your years of support. We look to the future to serve you and IOWA. Please read about the award below. . . . Tom



Each year, at the American Association of Orthodontists' annual meeting, residents throughout North America compete by presenting records of their best treated cases (patients treated during their residency).

- In 2014, of the 56 orthodontic programs represented (168 cases on display, total), the University of Iowa won 2<sup>nd</sup> PLACE.
- In 2015 of the 64 programs represented (192 cases on display), the University of Iowa won 1st PLACE.
- And now, in 2016, of the 66 programs represented (199 cases on display), the University of Iowa won 1st PLACE!

As illustrated below, 80% of the Iowa orthodontic residency program graduates have passed the American Board of Orthodontics Initial Certification Examination using records of patients they treated during their residency. This contrasts with only 32.6% nationwide.


