Pediatric Dental Residency

We increased the class size of the residency program over the past two years at Iowa. We currently have five second-year residents, Joan Attridge from Indian Health Services, Megan Rohman and Nicole Youngers who came from private practice, Reem Oweis who just completed her PhD in Oral Sciences, and Zach Percival who came directly from dental school.

Pediatric Dentistry continues to be a popular post-graduate program. In 2017 there were 676 applications for 408 positions. We consistently receive over 100 applications and we interviewed 23 people for five positions. We were able to attract a diverse group of students from various undergraduate training programs as well as the University of Iowa. Our first-year residents are Bryce Evans (SIU), Nathan Green (Nebraska) and Kirstina Gratz (Iowa) from private practice and Casey Goetz (Iowa) and Elizabeth Wilkinson (UMKC). The addition of residents gives us the opportunity to provide more services to our patients at the new University of Iowa Stead Family Children's Hospital; including the pediatric specialty clinics and the procedural sedation area. The hospital now has their operating rooms for pediatric patients in the pediatric hospital so we work with staff and providers that are dedicated to children. We are excited for the addition of a procedural sedation room. This is similar to the types of sedations that many of you may be providing in your practices. We are excited because this gives another level of training for our residents and provides patients with another option for care. Residents and faculty still spend quite a bit of time walking between the dental school, CDD and the hospital, but we now only go to one area at the hospital.

Research

Dr. Arwa Owais -Director of Pediatric Dentistry Research

The Department of Pediatric Dentistry research activities include advancing research related to oral health of infants, toddlers, children, and those with special health care needs. Special emphasis on

prevention and management of early childhood caries is evident through the peer-reviewed publications and presentations on local and national levels. The department's research activities consist of clinical trials, lab studies, surveys and secondary data analysis. Over twenty abstracts were presented by faculty, preand post-doctoral students this past year at the national level including the American Association of Dental Research Annual Meeting, National Oral Health Conference and the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry. The Department received grants from Delta Dental of Iowa Foundation to enhance oral health of children. We are currently part of a multicenter clinical study on the use of silver diamine fluoride in children.

Areas of current research include: Early Childhood Caries risk factors among children attending the Johnson County WIC Clinic, medical management of caries using silver nitrate and silver diamine fluoride, Hall-technique stainless steel crowns, referral sources and patterns for the College of Dentistry, and Pediatricians involvement in children's oral health.
