Free dental screenings and fluoride varnish applications were offered to children attending the Iowa Children's Museum on February 26 as part of the "Give Kids a Smile" program. Packets containing free toothbrushes, toothpaste and educational materials were provided for each child. Notes summarizing the results of the dental screenings and information on resources and programs offering financial assistance for follow-up treatment were provided.
