Proclamation in conjunction with the ADA's National Children's Dental Health Month.

In recognition of Children's Dental Health Month, the dental student group was very busy participating in community outreach activities. On Saturday February 11, they presented an interactive one hour presentation at the Johnson County Fairgrounds to 4-H students, fourth through eighth grade. Utilizing visuals and props, the dental students set up 20 stations of questions that the 4-H students rotated through. They then used a PowerPoint presentation to review the answers and discuss careers in dentistry. On February 24, the pediatric dental student group participated in the annual "Give Kids a Smile" program at the Iowa Children's Museum. Over a 100 children received free dental screenings and fluoride varnish applications. The children also received oral hygiene instructions and packets containing free toothbrushes, toothpaste and educational materials. Notes summarizing the results of the dental screenings and information on resources and programs offering financial assistance for follow-up treatment were provided.

Drs. Tad Mabry and Matt Geneser recently presented continuing education courses.

Dr. Mabry's program was entitled "The Principles of Pediatric Restorative Dentistry" and was delivered to dental professionals in the Quad Cities area at the Western Illinois

Three of our second-year residents presented their research. Faculty member Dr. Arwa Owais presented an oral presentation entitled "Iowa Biorepository: A Unique Opportunity for Precision Medicine and Collaborative Research."

Five dental students mentored by our department faculty also presented their research at the Annual Meeting of the Iowa Section of the American Association for Dental Research.
