Our dental students have been very active in pediatric dentistry activities. The student pediatric dentistry group teamed up with area dental professionals on October 1 for the Special Olympics Iowa MEDFEST held in Iowa City. At the Special Smiles station, volunteers provided oral health education and dental screenings, made protective mouthguards, and applied fluoride varnish for the athletes. The student pediatric dentistry group also participated in a large Halloween event at Sycamore Mall in Iowa City on October 30. The annual event has become a popular Iowa City tradition and the U of IA's pediatric dentistry students have been notable participants for several years.

Dr. Rebecca Slayton was inducted as a Fellow of the International College of Dentists during its 82nd Annual Convocation in Las Vegas, Nevada, on October 10. The International College of Dentists is an honorary organization that recognizes outstanding and meritorious service to the profession and community.
